1) to raise some Hell

LEAD-IN QUESTIONS

A mine is where you take out deposits of ore which are basically rocks. They are sometimes taken to a mill where they are ground into smaller rocks or a powder form. The next step is the smelter where they are heated up in big furnaces to a few thousand degrees, changing the substance into liquid form. This liquid is then moved to different places in the smelter in big pots where it is attempted to extract a more pure form of one or more of the metals. The work is hot, dirty and dangerous.
