FIRST & SECOND CONDITIONALS

Remember the forms and what they refer to

FIRST CONDITIONAL

used for a future action or situation that might occur



IF + SITUATION

(verb tense is *present*) If we make many changes

CONSEQUENCE

future form (will, be going to, might, etc) we can reduce pollution. we will definitely live longer.

would (or might/could/should) + base we could reduce pollution. we would definitely live longer.

SECOND CONDITIONAL

used for a present or a future action or situation



(verb tense is *past*) If we made many changes

a) very unlikely to occur (ex: win the lottery or snow in the desert) or

b) impossible to occur (ex: turn a tree into gold)

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Correct these questions

- What will you do tomorrow if it will rain tomorrow?
- What will you do if you wake up tomorrow and you're four years old?
- What will you buy me if you win the lottery?
- If you learn some things in today's class, would you come back next week?

What....do

Write 2 or 3 'first conditional' questions to ask somebody (about tonight / tomorrow / next weekend)

Some ideas: Where....go

Ex: What will you eat for supper if you're not very hungry tonight?

Write 2 or 3 '2nd conditional' questions to ask somebody (about now / tomorrow / next weekend)

Ex: What would you have for breakfast if there was no bread, milk or coffee in the world?
