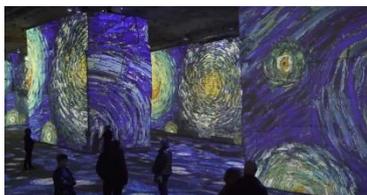




A lovely magical presentation of many works of Vincent Van Gogh in a Paris museum with music by Don McLean.

TEACHING SUGGESTIONS



NOTE: The video starts the song at the third verse but the complete song is in the handout.

- 1-Ask the students what they know about Van Gogh... 2- Give out the student handout... 3- Have the students speak briefly in pairs... 4- Play the video and have the students fill in the blanks.

DISCUSSION THEMES:

Is there much difference between the art of an average person and that of one who breaks new ground or achieves high levels? Do you think the arts has a great impact on humanity and our civilization? Would it be comparable to technology or religion or the idea of government? What do you consider not art? Can art be evaluated? Can it be learned or taught?
